Children and Baptism

At The Harbor Church, we wait until our children are old enough to believe and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them. Some churches practice a "baptism of confirmation" for children. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his own personal confession of Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed. This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible, which was only for those old enough to believe. The purpose is to confess your personal commitment to Christ publicly. At The Harbor Church, it is a membership requirement that every member have been baptized the way Jesus demonstrated, even though many of us were "confirmed" as children.
