PAUL'S ABILITY

EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES

"I received my training at the feet of Gamaliel, and I was schooled in the strictest observance of our fathers' Law." Acts 22:3 (Ph)

I have been in **prison** more times...**near death** often...been **whipped** five times with thirty-nine lashes by the Jews and three times by the Romans...once **stoned**...I've been in three **shipwrecks**...and once spent twenty-four hours in the water...In my travels I've been **in danger** from floods...robbers...enemies... wild animals and false friends...I've served long hours **without sleep** or **food** or **shelter** or even **clothing**..." 2 Corinthians 11:23-27 (LB)

THE HARBOR CHURCH MINISTRY STATEMENT

(Our Philosophy of Ministry)

WHAT WE BELIEVE

... ABOUT MINISTRY:

- Salvation in Jesus Christ automatically includes a **call to ministry**. Every believer is created, saved, called, gifted, authorized, and commanded to minister.
- **Ministry** is the heart of the Christian life (Matthew 20:28).
- God has S.H.A.P.E'.d each person uniquely for a **specific** ministry.
- Developing and using your gifts is an act of good **stewardship** and of **worship**.
- As we have seen, you can discover your ministry by identifying your gifts. But an even better way is to discover your gifts by *participating* in a ministry!
- The evidence of the right match between your "S.H.A.P.E." and your ministry is **fruitfulness** and **fulfillment**.
- **Membership** and **growing** maturity are prerequisites to ministry.

... ABOUT THE BODY OF CHRIST:

- God intends for ministry to be performed in the context of the local church. Membership includes a commitment to ministry.
- The Holy Spirit has provided our church body with all the spiritually gifted people needed to do everything He wants done. Our task is to discover, enlist, train, and support these people in ministry.

- The church is to operate on the basis of spiritual gifts rather than elected offices. We **do not elect** people to ministries. *"A man's gift makes room for him."* Proverbs 18:16 (NASB)
- The church is a **body**, not a business; an **organism**, not an organization.
- The mobilization of every member as a minister is the key to balanced growth for the church.

... ABOUT THE ROLE OF PASTORS:

- The equipping of the members for ministry is the number one priority of the pastoral staff. The people are the ministers, and the pastors are the administrators (Ephesians 4:11-12).
- The objective of Harbor University: U-100 U-400 series is to **mobilize** and **equip** an army of ministers who are maximizing their unique spiritual gifts, hearts, abilities, personalities, and experiences in a meaningful place of service in our church.
- Every member deserves personal assistance in discovering a meaningful place of service.
- Those involved in ministry are entitled to competent leadership from the staff.

... ABOUT ACCOUNTABILITY:

- We become what we are **committed** to.
- Everything rises or falls on **leadership**.
- One mark of a maturing church is that the standards for leadership are constantly being raised!
- There must be periodic reviews of all ministries to evaluate their effectiveness.

... ABOUT TRAINING:

- Every leader is a **learner**. The moment you stop learning, you stop leading.
- We emphasize on-the-job training more than pre-service training. We learn best by **doing**. We delegate tasks to people in order to allow them to grow.

... ABOUT DIVERSITY OF MINISTRY:

- We have unity without uniformity.
- Every ministry must fill one or more of the basic purposes of the church, or we don't do it.
- Ministries have **life cycles**. If a ministry isn't meeting a need anymore, we will give it a decent burial. There are no sacred cows!
- Only official ministries of The Harbor Church, under staff supervision, are given promotion and publicity.
- Your *primary* ministry commitment should be in the area in which you're **gifted and called**.
- Your *secondary* ministry commitment should be to serve in any other area of the body in which you are **needed**.
- You are not ready for ministry until you are willing to serve *anywhere* and take on *any task*.

... ABOUT PERFORMANCE:

- We expect **excellence** and **effort** in ministry, not perfection.
- We encourage **creativity** and **innovation** in ministry, which assumes mistakes will be made.
- A failed project does not mean a failed person, or a failed ministry!

Appendix B Spiritual Gift Categories and Descriptions

At The Harbor, we subscribe to the belief that the Spiritual Gifts all operate in our lives via the office of the Holy Spirit. To better understand these gifts, we've organized them into three major categories, or types:

- Ministry Gifts (1 Corinthians 12:5, Ephesians 4:11-13, 1 Corinthians 12:28)
- Manifestation Gifts (of the Holy Spirit) (1 Corinthians 12:7-11)
- Motivational Gifts (Romans 12:6-8)

Ministry Gifts

- Apostles have the gift to communicate across cultural barriers and plant churches where there is no knowledge of the Gospel. It is usually accompanied by a distinct calling and a miraculous lifestyle. In Greek (*apostolos*) "a sent one", or "a messenger", a Missionary.
- Prophets have the calling to speak the heart of God
- **Evangelists** have the gift to lead unconverted persons to a saving knowledge of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The person with this gift has the wisdom to know when, who, and how to call the rebellious into the Kingdom of God. Evangelists are the spiritual "obstetricians" in the church.
- Pastors is the collective (plural in Greek) ministry of the Elders to "shepherd" an individual or community of Christian believers. This gift is a special passion and empowering to lead people into green pastures, steer others away from danger, fight off predators, and bind up wounds. Sometimes called the gift of Shepherding.
- Teachers (see "Teaching" below)
- Helpers (or Helps) enables one to assist people in skilled ways that are supernaturally enhanced by the anointing of the Holy Spirit. This is similar to the gift of serving except that it is specific concerning a certain skill - such as the goldsmiths who helped Moses build the items for the tabernacle. Those with this gift should be highly esteemed in the Body.
 - Administration is a "Helps" gift that provides insight into other people's spiritual gifting as well as natural talent, which allows for placing people who want to minister in a particular way together with those who need just this ministry.

Manifestation Gifts

• Love is the only gift that Scripture tells us will NEVER pass away! Without the gift of love, all other gifts are fruitless and are exercised in vain. (1 Corinthians 13:1-10)

- Message of_Wisdom is special illumination that enables one in a specific instance to grasp the divine insight regarding a fact, situation, or context. This gift is useful in directing the Body in what to do next; in making God's will known.
- Message of Knowledge is an ability to remember Scripture or have it supernaturally quickened, or to possess facts or truths about a person or situation as they are revealed directly by the Holy Spirit.
- **Faith** as a gift is an extraordinary confidence in God that is unshakable by situations, pain, apparent failure, or ridicule. While we are all called to have faith, this is an extraordinary amount of faith above and beyond that of Christians without this gift. This gift strengthens the individual and other believers (by example) to endure persecution and wait upon the Lord.
- Gifts of Healing operates to miraculously cause diseases and medical conditions to be resolved without medical intervention. Note that medicine and medical professionals may be involved, but God completes and performs the healing. This gift is given by God, via the Holy Spirit, as it is needed with each occurrence being an incident of gifting.
- Miraculous Powers are in evidence when supernatural results are obtained via a human agency that doesn't possess any power in and of themselves.
- **Prophecy** (see "Prophesying" under Motivational Gifts).
- Distinguishing between spirits is the heightened ability to read or hear a teaching, to encounter a problem, or to consider a proposed course of action and then determine whether the source behind the teaching, problem, or action is divine, merely human, or satanic. This will be a much-needed gift near the End of the Age.
- **Speaking in Tongues** is the delivering of a divinely inspired message, given by the Holy Spirit, in a language in which the speaker has no formal training or knowledge.
- Interpretation of Tongues is the translation of a message spoken under the influence of the Holy Spirit into a commonly understood language such that those who witnessed a message in tongues may have understanding. According to the scriptures, any genuine message in tongues must be accompanied by an interpretation or it is not genuine.

Motivational Gifts

- **Prophesying** is speaking what God wants said with clarity, creativity, and power. The primary ministry of this gift is not prediction, but in confronting people with the truth about God and man with conviction and repentance as a result.
- **Serving** is a gift which expresses the love of Christ by taking care of lowly or time-consuming tasks to allow others to be more effective ministers. Similar to the gift of helps, but here the work performed is menial rather than skilled. Those with this gift are the truest and highest leaders in the church, and ought to be recognized and honored as such.

- **Teaching** is the ability to understand and communicate the Christian faith so as to make the truth clear to others. The result of this gift is the equipping and maturing of others in the body of Christ so that they will grow in grace and be more effective disciples.
- **Encouraging** is the gift of being able to encourage others by well-timed and wise counsel. This gift builds the Body of Christ by helping new, young or immature Christ-followers to turn from sin and believe in the power of the Holy Spirit. Barnabas, whose name literally means Son of Encouragement, is the best example of this in the Bible. Also called the gift of **Counseling**, or the gift of **Exhortation**.
- **Giving** empowers one in a sensitive way to detect material or financial needs and meet those needs with Spirit inspired generosity. Recipients of help from Christians with this gift have a clear sense that God has provided, not man.
- Leadership in the Greek is actually "he who provides leadership in giving aid". These go first and lead by example, so that others are motivated to follow. (1 Cor 11:1) Those with the gift of leadership are quick to identify problems and show by doing how to minister to those in need.
- Mercy transcends both natural human sympathy and normal Christian concern, enabling one to sense in others a wide range of emotions and then provide a supportive ministry of caring and intercessory prayer. Also called the gift of Compassion.
